

Information you need to know

Time: Show will start 9:00 AM Sharp!

Directions: From the south, take the north-east extension to Mahoning Valley exit. (1st exit after tunnel) Take 209 North for 4 miles. Look for Country Junction on LEFT. When you see Country Junction, make the first RIGHT onto Strohls Valley Road. *Make the next right into the driveway. Follow around to the Y, stay to the right, and head for the big red indoor arena. Park in the field behind the arena.

From the north, go south on Rt. I-80. You can go either Rt. 115 or Rt. 715 south until you hit Rt. 209 South. Follow Rt. 209 South until you see Country Junction on your right. Make a LEFT onto Strohls Valley Road.

*Follow from above.

From Stroudsburg Area: Take I-80 West to Rt. 33 South. Take Rt. 33 South to Rt. 209 South towards Lehighon. Follow Rt. 209 South until you see County Junction on your right. Make a LEFT onto Strohls Valley Road. *Follow from above.

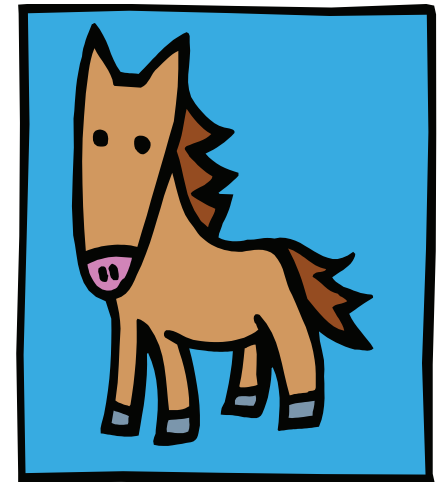

Rules and Regulations:

1. Current Negative Coggins is required for all horses. The dam's Coggins will be accepted for foals of the current year.
2. Keystone Miniature Horse Club reserves the right to cancel, combine, or split classes as entries warrant.
3. **An approved helmet is highly recommended for all persons under 18. One is required for riding and driving!**
4. Removal of the bridle while a horse is hitched to a vehicle is cause for elimination.
5. American Miniature Horse Registry rules will apply.
6. Only Miniature Horses are permitted. No other animals.
7. Clipping of horse and show clothes are not required.
8. The judges decisions are final. At no time will any abuse of animals and/or unsportsmanlike behavior be tolerated.

9. No Alcoholic beverages permitted on stable premises.

10. **NO SMOKING IN BARN OR ON GROUNDS!**

11. STATEMENT OF LIABILITY:

All exhibitors will be under the control and direction of the management, but the Keystone Miniature Horse Club, owners of the facility, the show management, and personnel will in no case be responsible for any loss, theft, injury, or damage that may occur to the exhibitor, his/her personal property and/or horse(s). Each exhibitor will be solely responsible for their own liabilities incurred, as well as damage or injury to any other person or property, caused by the exhibitor or any horse in their charge.
